The Aurukun Mission, situated on the west coast of the Cape York Peninsula, was established in 1904 by Moravian missionaries sponsored by the Presbyterian Church.

In the early seventies, over 200 children attended the school, which was staffed by mission personnel. The work in this collection was done in 1971-72 by 2nd and 3rd grade pupils in a combined grade taught by Annette Mitchell
